

We come together this weekend to give praise and glory to God in a spirit of gratitude. We are grateful to God for the gift of faith that blossoms within us and for God's healing presence in each one of us and in the world, which makes us whole again. During the pandemic there have been times collectively or individually we have not been able to be together. We are especially grateful whenever we can do so once again. Let us maintain our gratitude for God's blessings always.

Thanks to all the students, parents and parishioners who took part in the previous Wednesday evening (Sept 28). Deb Hadley spoke at length of her Catholic faith and how it helped her overcome the death of her 24 yr old daughter Kaley and 7 months later her 20 yr old son Tyler killed in a car accident. She said that over 2,000 times in the bible God says you will have trouble. It is normal. Expect it to happen, such is why we know and trust God. This trouble is very purposeful as there is purpose in suffering. Lastly, suffering is powerful as God can refine you as it takes unconditional faith from us and "trust God no matter what". A question to reflect upon: "Is your relationship with God truly the most important thing in your life?" Deb says, everything that has happened to me has already happened to His disciples. All are invited to join us in Elmdale next Saturday (Oct 15) for a special 5pm Mass in St. Edward's. Please note that there will not be the regularly scheduled 8pm Mass. Stay afterward for potluck supper to be held in the church basement. We will be celebrating the Feast of St Edward. He lived from about 1003 to 1066. St. Edward is the Patron Saint of difficult marriages and separated spouses. He is usually depicted on medals as wearing a crown on his head. His piousness is well-known and he is once said to have taken a ring off his finger and handed it to a poor beggar. A famous painting hangs in the church that memorializes the gift of St. Edward. Today his name is called upon when marriages are struggling to survive in a world where to many marriages are treated as less than sacred. The first church was built and blessed in 1882. Due to efforts of 18 families who donated \$9,000 in depression times, the second and present church was built in 1920.

New Monstrance Blessing will also take place at all our weekend Masses October 15/16. St Mary's has purchased this beautiful vessel months ago and it has finally arrived. Following Holy Communion, we will have a few moments of prayer and adoration marking this special time. As Catholics, the Eucharist is central to our faith. May each of our parishes continue to deepen our love for Our Sweet Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. David
