#### **NOTES FROM FR. DAVID**

The greatest gift each of us has ever received was the gift of life itself. That gift was given to us most directly by our parents, whose life in turn was given to them by their parents, and so on. But ultimately the Author of life, the giver of every great gift, is God. We come together this weekend in thanksgiving for that precious gift, which led to the gift of eternal life, promised by God's Son to all who follow Him.

Thanks to Janice Wuebkers for going above and beyond by helping us ever so faithfully. She is now employed at the Newman Center Church in St Cloud as Office Manager as well as works at the Holdingford Office one day a week. Thanks to Chantelle Frie who has been filling in this past month. No doubt without all their hard work and dedication working on the weekly bulletin, paying our bills and day-to-day responsibilities would not have taken place. Thanks also to Laura Horvath-Douvier who has been learning from Janice the necessary bookkeeping skills. She has recently committed to helping us out also as the secretary while the search continues to find a new Office Manager. Laura currently works parttime at the Post Office in Upsala. With the Delta variant along with the coronavirus, we are reminded that we still are not out of the woods. Bishop's August 18th letter to Catholic School Principals and Pastors has a number of applicable points for us as well: "It is very important that we work with our families through the frustrations and divisions we have experienced in this pandemic. We must regularly remind one another of the love of God and the joy of the Gospel as the reasons we are called together. The changing conditions with the coronavirus require us to be vigilant in both our safety practices and in the hospitality of our hearts. We must model love and respect through our actions, particularly in being consistent and steady in what we require of our families.

I want to be clear in my support of three key prevention measures: 1. COVID-19 vaccination. This is the most effective way in which we can slow transmission of the virus and provide safe places of learning. I do not require vaccinations, but urge eligible people to receive them. 2. Face masks for unvaccinated persons. This is especially important when there are high levels of transmission surrounding parish and school communities. While not required across all diocese schools, I strongly encourage the practice to protect all who are not yet eligible for vaccination. 3. Quarantines for close contact exposures. These are required, and they protect against potential spread from confirmed cases.

We know that there will be further developments with the virus in the weeks and months ahead. As your bishop, I ask you to be open to new ways to respond to the needs of our students, families and employees. As you listen to them and journey with them, share your wisdom with other leaders and pastors. Learn from them, too. Together, let us meet these challenges with hope and confidence I the promises of our loving God." Bishop Donald J. Kettler
