- 5. Memorize or meditate on Scripture verses and places in the Catechism that highlight the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Luke 2:19, Luke 2:51, CCC #964
- 6. Begin this August to go to Confession and Mass on the Five First Saturdays of the month, keeping the request of Our Lady of Fatima.





### The Queenship of Mary

This Friday we celebrate the Memorial of the Queenship of Mary, which was proclaimed by Pope Pius the XII in 1954, exactly four years after he created the Fourth Marian Dogma with the Feast of the Assumption. Henceforth, the church recognizes Mary as the Queen of Heaven and earth, but it is important to keep in mind the origins of this idea are biblical.

When the Angel Gabriel visits Mary, he announces that she will bear a son who will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David. He will rule over the house of Jacob forever and his reign will be without end. (Luke 1:32)

For centuries across the medieval period, great saints referred to her with the title of "Queen" and thousands of poems and songs called Marian Antiphons were sung at churches across Europe with this real and true title.

What does this mean for us? With two Marian-themed parishes in our cluster, it means we should think often about the idea that the Blessed Mother shared in the Kingship of her Son Jesus Christ. Because she lived perfectly in the Divine Will of God the Father, and due to her powers of intercession, she too has a role in the history of redemption. Mary, Queen of the Universe, pray for us!
