Notes from Fr David

Tomorrow (Nov 1) we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints, when we recognize those many men and women who we believe have gained the eternal reward and are forever in the presence of God. This weekend, we hear Jesus tell a scribe, "You are not far from the kingdom of God," suggesting that this anonymous functionary was close to being a saint. To be a saint should be our goal, so let us listen to the Gospel and pray that we take Jesus' words to heart and put them into action.

All Souls' Day (Nov 2), we recall all those who have gone before us, who we pray that in the fullness of time will live in the blessed company of the angels and saints in the presence of the Lord. We will come together that day as we will have three Masses offered, seeking God's compassion in our grief for those whose passing we mourn. However, we remember not only the dead, but Jesus' triumph over death. His resurrection redeemed us, opening the gates of Heaven to all who love Him. Let us pray on this holy day and in the month of November that our loved ones may receive divine mercy for their sins and rest in eternal peace with the Lord.

This past Saturday (Oct 23), six of us attended the 2021 Diocesan Ministry Day at St. John's University to open the Synod (Journeying together in listening to the Holy Spirit as we listen to each other). Cindy Liliana Gonzalez, spoke about 'Radical Hospitality' as she presented, in both English and Spanish, the idea of welcoming 'the stranger.' Afternoon sessions were small group 'beginning consultations', the first of many during this Synod where we will listen to each other in order "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions...weave together relationships and awaken the dawn of hope in our Catholic faith". Now, we are invited to ask how this "journeying together" is happening in our church. Now, we are asked how can we welcome as Jesus welcomes.

Next weekend kicks off National Vocation Awareness (Nov 6-13). National Vocation Awareness Week is an annual celebration of the U.S. Catholic Church dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education, and calling the faithful to pray for and support those who are considering such a vocation. "Studies of those recently ordained and religiously professed consistently show that the encouragement of the parish priest is the most influential factor in vocational discernment," Bishop Checchio said in an Oct. 20 statement about the upcoming weeklong observance.
