



Sing Psalm and Alleluia

"From now until Ash Wednesday (Feb 17), we will continue singing the Responsorial Psalm and Alleluia. With the likely changes for our choirs beginning the First Sunday of Lent, it will be interesting to see how everything unfolds. Stay tune ." Fr David

Updates from Bishop's Office

Choirs and vocal ensembles may return to rehearsals beginning Jan. 18 under certain parameters. Additionally, "protocols for small vocal ensembles to return to singing during Mass are currently being formulated with the intention of granting permission for groups of up to six vocalists to resume ministry beginning with the First Sunday of Lent," Bishop Kettler wrote.

The Office of Worship will host an evening Zoom meeting in the near future for music ministers during which the protocols and best practices will be discussed. Congregational singing, however, is still not permitted. Also, choirs/vocal ensembles are still not permitted to sing during any public event or liturgy until further notice.

NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

This weekend's Gospel features Jesus calling His first disciples. The invitation is welcoming and intriguing: "Come, and you will see." How are we called by Jesus? Jesus has called us on this weekend in the middle of January and so we have come together to listen to God's word (also those watching Mass on TV/internet) and to receive our Lord in the Eucharist. How is Jesus speaking to us today?

Our diocese will join all dioceses of the United States in observing a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.) Churches around the United States use the day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage. The protection of human life and promotion of human dignity are core tenets of Catholic and social teaching rooted in Scripture. This month we pray in a special way for an end to abortion. I hope that your schedule allows you to join us for our 7:30am Mass on Friday. Mass will be kept to 30 minutes as I know many of you have to be at work.

Bishop Kettler: "While the situation with COVID-19 is showing continued signs of improvement, we are still waiting to see what impact holiday travel and multi-household family gatherings during the Christmas season may have on infection rates," he wrote Jan. 6. "Health officials also are monitoring the progress of a variant of the virus that is not yet widespread in the U.S. but is reportedly more easily transmitted."

The Minnesota Department of Health reported 2,165 new cases January 10. The seven-day averages have declined substantially after peaking in November, when the state averaged more than 7,000 cases per day for a time. Approximately 130,000 Minnesotans have now received the COVID-19 vaccine. MDH said Jan. 9 it had identified the new variant of the virus in five Twin Cities metro-area residents.

"I will make another assessment in the middle of the month and give you as much lead time as possible to make any adjustments regarding protocols," Bishop Kettler said. "Again, my hope is that we can return to in-person gatherings after Feb. 1, but I encourage you to plan for a variety of possibilities for conducting activities, including faith formation, in light of the present uncertainties surrounding this virus. This would include planning for in-person, hybrid and distance-learning options."

Men's Conference will not be taking place as usual due to the COVID-19 virus. However, this will be virtual: February 27 from 9am-12noon. As Lent begins, this retreat/Bible Study will have five presenters who will facilitate reflection opportunities on the Sunday Gospels of the Lenten season:
