


# Virtual Middle School Youth Rally

#### **NOTES FROM FR. DAVID**

At our baptism we were told, "you have become a new creation and have clothed yourself in Christ." Each Sunday we come here a new creation, transformed, even if we're not conscious of it. Baptism has created us anew, have given us new life. Also, no matter what we may be wearing, we are clothed in Christ. In what we do and what others see, we hope to show that we have put on Christ. On this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, let us appreciate the new creation we have become.

As we say good-bye to another Christmas, we hope and pray that we are closer to Christ. Let's begin the new year in prayer for hope and stronger faith. Pray for God's mercy and grace as we step into 2021. Let us walk by faith into the coming year, giving thanks to God for His compassion and righteousness. Entering the New Year focused on blessings and gratitude can help you draw closer to God and stay focused on His promises. No matter what the past year brought, God is wanting to use it to increase your faith. May these prayers truly inspire you in the renewing of your heart and mind.

Thanks so much for your financial contributions during our Christmas Season. You never cease to amaze me with your kindness and generosity. Bishop Kettler writes, "January is a month during which we highlight pro-life concerns. There are marches and prayer vigils throughout the country focused on the protection of children in the womb. We mark Jan. 22 — the anniversary of the Supreme Court's 1973 Roe v. Wade ruling that legalized abortion on demand — as a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. There also are ongoing efforts, similar to the "Walking with Moms in Need" initiative launched earlier this year by the U.S. bishops, to assist pregnant women facing challenging circumstances."

Were you able to read the article by Fr Tom Knoblach on vaccines and COVID-19 in our diocesan monthly magazine: The Central MN Catholic? It is well written, but hope that it wasn't too academic. The Vatican's coronavirus commission and the Pontifical Academy for Life issued a joint statement calling for a coordinated international effort to ensure the equitable distribution of COVID-19 vaccines worldwide. The document highlights the "critical role of vaccines to defeat the pandemic, not just for individual personal health but to protect the health of all," the Vatican said in a statement accompanying the document Dec. 29. "The Vatican commission and the Pontifical Academy of Life remind world leaders that vaccines must be provided to all fairly and equitably, prioritizing those most in need," the Vatican said. As I said last week, Bishop encourages one and all to receive the vaccine.
