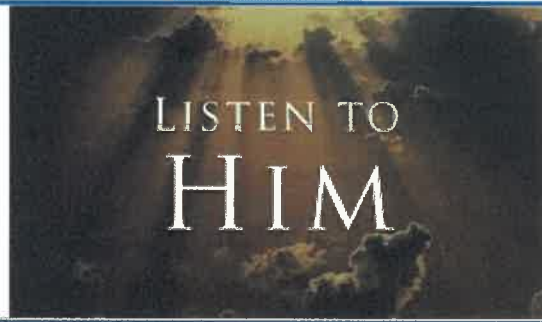

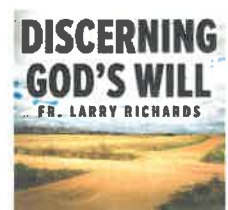

Safe Haven Sunday

Next weekend, in all parishes of our diocese and throughout most of the United States, we will be praying to stand up to this terrible pandemic of pornography. In 2016, a large U.S. Catholic high school anonymously surveyed the majority of their male students on pornography use. 57% consume pornography on their smartphones (61% in their bedrooms and/or 48% when they are bored). Only 11% of the students said they did not watch pornography at all. Parents, we will have about twenty copies of a booklet entitled: Connected: How Strong Family Relationships Lead To Internet-Safe Kids.

NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

"Listen to Him." In this weekend's Gospel, we hear God's voice from the heavens directing Peter, James and John, Jesus' closest disciples, to listen to Jesus. We can use this reminder as well. Are we listening to Him? How is Jesus speaking to us now as we pray, as we hear God's word, as we celebrate Mass in memory of what He has done for us? How might we better listen during Mass?

With Safe Haven Sunday next weekend, please pray that the Holy Spirit will descend upon on me in my preaching and that our parishes would be open to taking a stand against this great evil in our society. The Devil loves nothing more than to attack our children. To think that pornography did not exist until the invention of the camera came along. Think about this for a moment. The Old Testament cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were so wicked that God decided to destroy them (and they didn't have any pornography!). Can you imagine what God thinks about America today? Same-sex marriages? Abortion? "Lord have mercy on us." More smut flows out of America than any other nation on earth.

In our Trustee meeting held February 16th, one Trustee spoke of how in the Sacrament of Baptism parents promise to raise their children in the Catholic faith. In having a baptism the previous Saturday in Elmdale, these words to parents really stood out for me: **"you are undertaking the responsibility of raising him or her in the faith Do you understand this responsibility?"** Later in the ceremony: **"for your part, you must strive to bring him or her up in the faith, so that this divine life may be preserved from the contagion of sin, and may grow in him or her day by day".** And finally, **"Is it your will, therefore, that (name) should receive Baptism in the faith of the Church?"** Three times, parents promise and commit they will see to it that their child is brought up in the Catholic faith. This new curriculum: Family Formation simply provides the necessary tools for parents to teach the faith to their children. It is really, really user friendly.

Please check out the wonderful five-minute video on our webpage under 'New Religious Program'. Auxiliary Bishop Andrew Cozzens: *"This curriculum allows for the parents to bring the faith right into the home. The most important factor for a child to grow up and keep his or her Catholic faith is the practicing faith of the parents. Family Formation desires to provide opportunities to let parents hand on their faith fulfilling their mission."* Our current Religious Ed programs are doing the best they can, but might the LORD be inviting us to consider another curriculum? "Holy Spirit breathe on our parishes if this is God's will ... take away any fear and anxieties and replace it with peace. Amen." 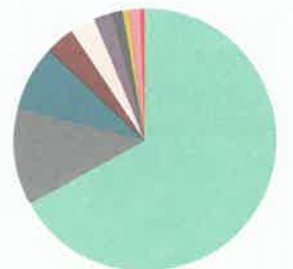
