

Notes from Fr David

When Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit descended upon Him like a dove and voice from the heavens rang out, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." No such dove was seen or voice was heard when we were baptized, yet the Holy Spirit did descend upon us in baptism and we were welcomed into this holy family, initiated into the body of Christ. Let us give thanks for the blessings we received in our baptism. In what ways might the Holy Spirit be nudging us to consider how better to unleash the graces of our baptism?

Bishop Kettler in his Dec 21st letter to his priests: "I encourage everyone who is eligible to receive COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters. Vaccinations offer an increased level of protection from the virus and reduce the likelihood of a person needing hospitalization if they contract the virus. This reduces the strain on our medical system to ensure it is able to meet the needs of its COVID as well as non-COVID patients. I encourage you to strongly recommend to parishioners attending Mass and larger indoor events/meetings to wear masks and practice physical distancing as much as possible." Please wear your mask when it's needed. When you're around people you're not familiar with, try to keep your six-feet distance. How better can each one of us become more mindful?
