



NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

In this weekend's Gospel, we hear the familiar passage in which the Son of Man separates the sheep from the goats, explaining to them that what they did (or failed to do) for the least of their neighbors, they did (or failed to do) for Him. As we gathered as a community of faith, let us look for the Lord in our neighbor, welcoming Christ in the stranger, providing for Him in the needy, comforting Him in the suffering, befriending Him in the lonely, and exulting with Him with those who are filled with joy.

On Thanksgiving Day, let us give thanks to all those people in our lives who make our lives better, from our loved ones whom we hope to join at table, to random people who provided little kindnesses to us along our way. In doing so, let us not forget the ultimate source of all goodness and life, who created us, saved us, sanctifies us, and brings us together to celebrate the Eucharist, the feast that literally means thanksgiving.

Advent begins next weekend and is the liturgical season that precedes and prepares for Christmas. It is a season of hope and of longing, of joyful expectation and of peaceful preparation. Many symbols and traditions are associated with Advent, especially the Advent Wreath with its four colored candles (three purple and one pink). Even amidst this pandemic, let's use Advent well and wisely. That means spiritual preparation. If you cannot attend daily Mass, at least meditate on the Scripture readings assigned to the Masses of the season. Since the Church's "particular voice" for the season is Isaiah, try to read a chapter a day of that prophetic book. Make friends with the key figures of the season: John the Baptist and his parents for the first half; Our Lady and St. Joseph for the second half. Having lived the first Advent two millennia ago, they can provide us with valuable examples for us who seek to do so today.

I hope that everyone will be have an opportunity to come to Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Catholic Church encourages us to receive Jesus twice throughout the year during Advent and Lent. With the pandemic, it likely has been very difficult for you to receive this sacrament. December 6th from 2-5pm at St. Mary's in Upsala, we will have three retired priests (Frs Bob Harren, Virgil Helmin, Eb Schefers) along Fr Gregory Mastey and myself available to hear your confession. Know that on the weekends, I will be in the confessional prior to the Masses. Did you know that upon Resurrection, giving the disciples this beautiful sacrament was the first thing that Jesus did? Special graces are available when you come to Jesus in this sacrament.

Thanks for all the names being written in our Book of Remembrance. No doubt with November the month of Poor Souls that special graces are going to our loved ones. With Advent fast approaching, this book will be removed. Remember that there is no greater prayer for our loved ones than by offering Mass intention.
