Anointing of the Sick

"I would like to speak to you of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, which enables us to touch with our hand God's compassion for humanity. In the past it was called "Extreme Unction", because it was understood as spiritual comfort in the imminence of death. To speak, instead, of the "Anointing of the Sick," helps us to widen our look on the experience of sickness and suffering, in the horizon of God's mercy." (Pope Francis, Feb 26, 2014) Especially the aged/elderly and those seriously sick are encouraged to receive this sacrament often for Jesus comes to you with healing and strength. For the weekday Masses August 4-7, in place of the homily Fr David will make this sacrament available.

Future Installation of Fr David

Sacrament of Reconciliation

"Sacramental confession is the way of sanctification for both the penitent and the confessor. And you, dear young confessors, you will soon experience it," he said. "As confessors, we have the privilege of constantly contemplating miracle conversions." (Pope Francis addressed priests and seminarians, March 29, 2019) Is that not something to think that when you come to Jesus in this sacrament, you not receive holiness for yourself, but help make the priest holier! Our God is an awesome God! On the flipside, when you stay away from Jesus in this sacrament, the priest's holiness is stifled. Confessionals are now being used as you are welcomed to come. The priest will have a mask available if that would make you feel more comfortable. Fr David will try to make himself more available throughout the week as well.

Mass Servers

Would you be willing to still ring the bells at Mass? That would be wonderful if you could do this as this adds so much to the Mass. If one server could come forward when we are reciting the Holy, Holy and then ring the bells at the proper times. You could return to your places while we are praying the Our Father. Fr David prefers to reserve this ministry for the servers, so in their absence or unwilling to come forward then no bells will be rung for that Mass.

Churches Open Regular Hours

Special blessings are received when we stop by our church to light a candle or spend some quiet time with Jesus. Prayer is, "first and foremost dialogue, a personal relationship with God," Pope Francis said. And in prayer, just like in any dialogue, it needs moments of silence "together with Jesus." This, he said, is because it is only in the "mysterious silence of God" that his word can resound in our hearts. Our Churches are open during daytime hours, and you are welcome to spend time in our churches.

Notes from Fr David

It is a great pleasure in the middle of these leisurely summer months to sit back and listen to stories. The crowds in the Gospel were able to do just that, for Jesus taught them by telling parables. Parables made His lessons about the kingdom of Heaven memorable, in ways in which straightforward narration would fail. Now it is our turn to listen. Let us savor them, mediating on their rich images and considering their meaning in our lives.

It just came to me how we need to be praying and offering Masses for our school systems both college and local schools. Please join be in storming Heaven with praying for Minnesota health and education officials. They have asked school administrators to plan for three scenarios on reopening in the fall under the cloud of the coronavirus, and promised a decision by the last week of July on whether students can return for inperson classes. And finally, we recently started 'Over 80 Blessing' which meant at the beginning of the month, those who will be celebrating birthdays 80 years and older would be mention. These ways might be a start in trying to better reach out to our elders. Please let me know your thoughts and ideas.

Are you open to joining me in our parish cemeteries for outdoor Masses during the week? Perhaps in the midst of this pandemic, people who feel unsafe coming to church might be willing to come join us. Stay tune as to dates and times which this would take place.

Each year priests and deacons would meet in Alexandria for Clergy Days Sunday evening through Wednesday. This was an important time to gather as one with the bishop addressing various topics and listening to a guest speaker. Oftentimes, this has proved most beneficial to our morale and strengthening our brotherhood. Unfortunately, in light of this pandemic it will be cut short.
