The Fourth Advent Candle : Love

"And in the end, everything else will turn out to be unimportant and inessential, except for this: Father, Child, and Love." ~St. Pope John Paul II

The fourth candle of Advent represents **Love**, the ultimate love of God that He might send His only Son for us. Called the "Angel's Candle," the fourth candle of Advent is lit the Sunday before Christmas, and it is the color purple, leading us to eagerly await the new Kingdom of God on earth. https://hallow.com/

The Three Masses of Christmas

Christmas is celebrated with three separate and distinct Masses. This tradition is very ancient, and it has been suggested that in this respect the Roman Church may have adapted an already established custom of the Jerusalem Church.

Mass during the night In the Roman Rite, the first Mass is the *Missa in nocte* ("Mass during the Night"). The stational church is the Basilica of Saint Mary Major, where the Popes used to celebrate this Mass at the Altar of the Crib (where the relics of the original manger are enshrined). The Gospel for this first Christmas Mass ("the Angels' Mass") is Luke 2:1-14, the familiar account of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem and of the angelic appearance to the shepherds [at midnight].

Mass at dawn

In earlier centuries, after this Mass, the Popes went to the nearby Church of Saint Anastasia, who was martyred on Dec. 25, 304. There the Popes celebrated the second Christmas Mass, the *Missa in aurora* ("Mass at Dawn"). The Gospel for this second Christmas Mass ("the Shepherds' Mass") is Luke 2:15-20, the account of the shepherds' adoration of the newborn Jesus. **Mass during the day**

Then the Popes went back to Saint Mary Major for the main Mass of Christmas at the main altar, the *Missa in die* ("Mass during the Day"). The Gospel for this third Christmas Mass is John 1:1-18, the famous "Prologue" to John's Gospel, which triumphantly proclaims that the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.
