

Parishes throughout our diocese took a special collection this weekend for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Nearly 30,000 elderly sisters, brothers and religious order priests benefit from this collection. Last year, our diocese donated \$149,687 to the collection. Many religious communities lack sufficient retirement savings. Rising health care costs and a growing number of senior members compound the challenge to meet retirement expenses. NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is the Latin word for rejoice. We rejoice this weekend, for the coming of the Lord is so near that we cannot help but think about it. Perhaps we are starting to feel overwhelmed by all of what we need to do between now and Christmas. Let this be an opportunity to refocus our attention on the true reason we celebrate this time of year. Rejoice, the Lord is near.

I pray that you are rejoicing more in having received Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation last Sunday! You are amazing how you came forth and opened up your soul to Jesus. We knew that it would not be easy for you, yet you did it! Thank you for coming to Jesus amidst this pandemic. All of the four other priests commented how beautiful it was to be a part of returning to God. We all were busy for nearly the entire three hours! Please check the schedule for remaining times to go to confession. Know that you can call to schedule a time that works best for you.

Thanks for attending the Holy Day Immaculate Conception Masses. How beautiful is it to witness your love for Mother Mary! It was awesome to see young people joining us and in particular at the 7:30am Mass. It is always hard to know when might be the best times to have these Masses. The attendance at our 8pm Mass in St Francis was the best. The church was filled! In the future, I think having another evening (Feast Day) Mass may be helpful. Yet the morning Mass in Upsala can be good for our children and young people before school.

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from today, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

The Minnesota Bankruptcy Court approved a plan Dec. 3 for reorganization jointly submitted by the Diocese of St. Cloud and the creditors' committee of clergy abuse survivors, according to a news release from the Diocese Dec. 4th.

"I again want to apologize on behalf of the Church to the survivors of clergy sexual abuse," Bishop Donald Kettler said. "Coming forward took a great deal of courage. The Church failed them, and I hope this helps them to move further along the path of healing and peace. I remain committed to ensuring the Church does everything it can to prevent sexual abuse."

"This reorganization plan represents the culmination of several years of respectful negotiations among all the parties involved," Bishop Kettler added. "Because of that, we were able to make today's announcement less than six months after the Diocese filed its bankruptcy petition with the court. This rapid process reduced the administrative expenses that would have been incurred in a longer process and preserved more funds for the survivors."
