Hail, and blessed be the hour and moment at which the Son of God was born of a most pure Virgin, in a stable, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold.

At that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, to hear my prayer and grant my desires. (Mention your intentions here).

Through Jesus Christ and His most Blessed Mother. Amen. It is piously believed that whoever recites the St. Andrew Christmas Novena FIFTEEN times each day from the feast of St. Andrew (Nov. 30th) until Christmas Eve will obtain the favor requested.

Advent Wreath

The use of the wreath and candles during Advent are a longstanding Catholic tradition. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. Individual evergreens that make up the wreath have their own meanings: The laurel signifies victory over persecution and suffering. The pine, holly, and yew signify immortality and the cedar signifies strength and healing. The pine cones that decorate the wreath symbolize life and resurrection. The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah. ~https://www.mercyhome.org/

The First Week of Advent: Be Strong! Let your heart take courage! Hope in the Lord! ~Psalm 27:14 Each of the candles of the Advent wreath represent a virtue, and an aspect of our preparation for Christ: hope, peace, joy and love. We begin Advent, as we light the first candle of the holy season, by asking the Lord to enflame us with hope. The hope of Advent is not hope that Jesus will come back into the world at Christmas. Jesus did come into the world, two thousand years ago: God-made-man, Word-made -lesh, in Bethlehem. This is a historical fact. Hope is rooted in history, but hope is also about our present and our future.

Notes from Father David

Already we are bombarded with urgent reminders to get ready for Christmas. But we gather in God's House to begin a different kind of preparation. Over the next four weeks (and it's a full four weeks this Advent), we will recall how Jesus comes to us. He has come as an infant lying in a manger. One day He will come like a thief in the night, as our judge at the end of time. But this weekend and every day He comes to us as Emmanuel, "God with us." Amid all the Christmas planning and holiday shopping, let us welcome God's most wonderful gift into our world, our homes, and our hearts.

What is the Holy Spirit placing upon your heart regarding a possible Parish Life Committee for each of our parishes? The numbers of members will be flexible. Some may have 4-5 members or another church may have 6-8 members. Initially we will not be having any term limits. We would need a Chair. This person would update me/the Pastor before and after any meeting. I/the Pastor need not be present at these gatherings. It will be flexible as how often to meet. Perhaps quarterly at first as each committee can determine what will work best for them. No doubt the Holy Spirit will place ideas or suggestions on your hearts as to how we might strengthen our parish. I pray that this will develop into you taking a more active involvement in our parish. I hope that this is bringing about discussion amongst one another such as if God is calling you and/or others to step forward in this ministry. If you are interested in learning more about this and/or even help create a Parish Life Committee in your parish, please contact me.

I am requesting your prayers and guidance. The Holy Spirit placed on my heart the possibility of a Stair Lift in the entrance of St Edward's.
