## Be a Listener For the Synodal Church

Do you want to plant dreams, draw forth a renewed vision, allow hopes to be nourished, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, and learn from one another for the sake of the Church? Would you be a listen-er? The Diocese of Saint Cloud is seeking to listen to 12,000 people between February and May 2022. We are looking for listeners to help us in group and/or oneon-one settings. What will a listener do? A one-on-one listener will host a conversation with individuals (our goal is 8 to 10 people over three months) about their experience of faith and the Catholic Church for approximately 30 to 60 minutes. Afterward, the listener will submit summary notes to a diocesan database. Those we listen to will not be identified by name. A group listener will facilitate a group experience that includes prayer, silence, individual reflection, small group conversation, and large group sharing. The size of these groups will vary for each group. Summary notes will be taken and submitted to a diocesan database. ## Notes from Fr David

Love your enemies, Jesus tells us, challenging society's values and even common sense. Why should we love those who have hurt us? Well, one of the greatest gifts we can give is our mercy. We may feel that our enemy doesn't deserve our mercy, but it may help to realize that is it God's mercy that we extend, that it's God mercy that counts. Let us think of those who have wronged us and pray that we can be instruments of God's mercy in their lives.

Thanks for doing your part regarding the Bishop's Annual Appeal. I have no doubt that each of our parishes will reach its goal. When we work together, great things will come about. These have been trying times, yet I cannot thank each one of you enough for staying close to your Catholic faith. As your Pastor, I will give \$1500 dividing evenly between our three parishes which will help meet our goal. Whatever amount you can sacrifice, know that it is most greatly appreciated.

Bishop Kettler's letter Feb 14: "We are all weary of the pandemic and what it has required from us over the last two years. We've had to make many sacrifices. But we make them in light of our Catholic faith, which calls us to show care and compassion for our neighbors, including the elderly and those with underlying health conditions for whom the virus can have devastating consequences. Wearing appropriate face coverings is a simple and effective way to reduce the spread of COVID-19. I am very grateful for the sacrifices you made for others.

At the time, health authorities predicted that we would experience the peak of the omicron variant in two to six weeks. I have been in regular contact with them, and I've been receiving good news. Positivity rates for the virus in our region have been steadily declining, as have the number of people hospitalized for COVID-19. The stress on health care resources is also lessening.

In light of these positive trends, I am lifting the face covering requirement for indoor parish activities starting the weekend of Feb 19-20. This includes Mass attendance, faith formation classes and other gatherings. Catholic schools also will update their protocols in light of this change. Pastors and principals have been sent specific guidance about this. Please continue to pray for an end to the pandemic and for all those who have been impacted by it.
