


Roseanne Throener (Member of the Holdingford Catholic Community but frequent visitor to our Three Saints Parishes, 320-573-9780): "As a homeschooling mom, I have always chosen to teach the faith in the home setting. We have used Family Formation off and on for fourteen years. What started out as a small program has grown extensively and is used throughout the country. I was surprised to see it at a church we visited in the Black Hills a few years ago. I have learned a lot from the program. This is Family Formation so the parents get to learn too! The curriculum is "easy breezy" to use as everything is written out and planned for you. You read the lesson, complete the activity or craft that is provided, and access the quizzes for the lessons using your smartphone. (Answers are provided!) Occasionally you will have to supply craft supplies like glue, markers, scissors or colored pencils. Lessons take around 45 minutes and it provides great opportunities for discussion and growth. If you have questions, I would be happy to answer any that you may have.'
