Notes from Fr David

As we approach the holiest week of the year, we get a taste of God's rich mercy and boundless generosity, eventually realized though Christ's ultimate sacrifice. The stories and reflections we hear in this weekend's readings illustrate the care God has for us all, despite our flaws, despite our sins. The fact that we hear these words in the context of this celebration deepens their meaning, for the Eucharist itself memorializes the sacrifice Jesus made and enables us to receive Him at the table of plenty.

Thank you for your prayers as we now have ten more adult members in our Church! Congrats to those who received the Sacrament of Confirmation the previous Sunday in Holdingford. The Church of St Hedwig's was filled to capacity! The music was heavenly and Fr Rolfes, Vicar General preached powerfully: "make Christ alive, make Christ present, bring Christ to the world, bring Christ to our parishes, bring the Church alive to all of us! Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful, kindle in them the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth. Amen."

As a priest, there is no greater joy than to listen in on your conversation with God when you come to Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is not just something gloomy for the guilt-ridden sacrament Catholics. What I see and experience is God's people meeting God. People with great dignity and maturity, for one of the most dignified and fully human things you can do is to admit you are not totally together and you need help. It is not a sign of weakness, but a sign of strength and self-reliance and true self-respect to say, "I can do better than that." It is a fully human and mature thing to say, "I am better than that, and I'm going to find forgiveness and pick myself up and try again — and, if I need to, get some help." For remember — grace is given. Grace is given not only for forgiveness, but for the power to overcome the sin. Grace is given that we might move ever upward to "grow up into the full humanity of Jesus Christ." Confession is Heaven come down to earth, with forgiveness in its wings. We are all prodigal sons and daughters on the journey home to Jesus. See you in Holdingford this Sunday from 2-5pm.
