OUR MISSION

We seek to provide an engaging environment where young Catholic men are able to listen to the voice of Jesus Christ. We desire to instill in their lives the faith and trust to follow Him no matter where He may lead.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP:

Tent, sleeping bag, camp clothes, lawn chair, bug spray, flashlight, swimsuit, towel, shampoo, deodorant, tooth-brush, toothpaste, sunscreen, rosary. (please label items, so owner can be found)

WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Cell phones.

(The vocations director and the seminarians helping with the camp will be giving out their cell phone number in case of emergency.)

This weekend is World Day of Prayer for Vocations!

As Catholics, we firmly believe that God has a plan for our lives! He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to religious life or to live as generous single people. Fully living our own vocations—and teaching young people how to discern God's call—is a serious duty, but also a joyful one. During this week, please encourage the young people in your life—children, grandchildren, students, and friends—to be open if God calls them to priesthood or religious life.

What happens in the Jubilee Year?

Every 25 years the church declares a year of Jubilee – what does this mean? In the Old Testament there were 4 different elements to the Jubilee Year: Slaves are set free, Debts are forgiven, Rest and play, and Everyone comes home. What could this mean to us?

Slaves are set free – none of us own slaves, but what areas of your hearts are enslaved? Enslaved to sin, unforgiveness, vice, anger? This year the Lord wants to set us free!

Debts are forgiven – how radically different would your life look if all of the sudden, all of your debts were forgiven? No mortgage, no credit card debt, no student loan debt... This year is a year where the Lord wants to forgive you radically! Make sure you are frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation. He is also calling you to forgive radically.

Rest and play – In the Old Testament, during a Jubilee Year they even let the land lay fallow. How can you enter into a "Sabbath rest" this year? Be intentional about not working on Sundays, plan a day every month to do something together as a family or with friends, (a game night, a campfire, a movie night, day trips, etc.) or learn a new craft or skill (painting, woodworking, or gardening to name a few).

Everyone comes home-Plan extra time to be with family, visit your elderly parents or grandparents or relatives in the nursing home, extra time to come home to the Father in prayer.

Jubilee Year of Hope extends through January 6, 2026.
