The Baptism of the Lord



In the Gospel of Luke, we learn of how astonished John the Baptist was to behold his cousin Jesus descending the banks of the Jordan River as he presented himself for baptism. John proclaims that he is the one who needs to be baptized by the Lord, and Jesus gently tells him *Let it be so now, for it is proper for us in this way to fulfill all righteousness.*


The crucial word enlisted by Jesus is "us." As mysterious as the idea is, Christ was fully God and fully human every minute he was on earth, and in this moment He submits

to baptism to endlessly connect His heart with ours, and we too enter into the waters of the same sacred river when we enter His church through baptism. As Jesus wades ashore, *suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw, God's Spirit descending like a dove and alighting on him.*¹⁷ *And a voice from the heavens said, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased."* This dramatic endorsement from God the Father is nothing less than the greatest gift the universe has ever seen: the Son of God who is our sacrifice, sanctification, and salvation. St. John the Baptist, who exhorted *us* to *Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his path*, pray for us! ~Jeff Johnson

Jesus the Teacher

In Luke's Gospel last Thursday, we inhabited one of the most astonishing moments in the Gospels, and world literature. Jesus' fame has quickly spreading, and he returns to his hometown of Nazareth to enter the synagogue on the Sabbath. Because of his ability to teach, he is handed the scroll to read aloud from Isaiah, and *He* is the actual subject of the text written eight centuries before his birth: *The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. He then proclaims,* "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Thirty percent of the Bible is prophecy; thirty percent of it is also written in verse. When we remember that the many books of the Old Testament prefigure and predict what happens in the New Testament, everything clicks into place! Across all four Gospels, Jesus recites most often the Psalms when he is teaching the apostles and the many crowds, and after that he quotes again and again from Isaiah. In doing this, he is gently telling us that we should all be reading from these books. Yes, they are ancient, but they explain all manifest reality, and everything we are living through as devoted Catholics making ready the way of the Lord. ~Jeff Johnson
