

NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

Each of us is our brother's (and sister's) keeper. This weekend, we hear God calling us to be responsible for each other. No one should be left on their own to fail; we are called to pick up each other up, to help each other out. This Labor Day Weekend, when we honor all those who work to do the things contribute to society, whether in a factory, on a farm, in an office, at home, or wherever it may be, let us resolve to work together in building the kingdom of God. Prayer warriors, please continue to storm Heaven for our confirmation candidates with prayers as well as for our open Youth Minister position.

Thank you for your positive comments and prayers after last Sunday's letters from Bishop Kettler. This is all part of taking up our cross and following Jesus. This Chapter 11 reorganization represents the diocese's commitment to finding a fair resolution for survivors of sexual abuse while continuing its ministry to those it serves throughout our 16-county diocese. The funds used to compensate survivors are made up of insurance and benefits coverage settlements, cash and property contributions from the diocese, and contributions from parishes. It seems that we will hear shortly as to what will be the amount being asked from each of our parishes. Like I said last weekend, I believe that by December or January, things will be drawing to a close with the bankruptcy court.

First of all, I want thank everyone for doing your part regarding wearing face coverings, sanitizing your hands, keeping social distance, etc. Know that it is greatly appreciated how you simply take it upon yourselves to do what you need to do. For those unable to comply with these and other demands due to health issues or whatever, please be at peace. I pray that no one is looking at you wondering why you may not do this or that. I think that I speak for everyone by saying we are just so happy and grateful that all who are able to join us for Mass helps make us all stronger. We need one another.

Secondly, I want to thank our ushers who truly stepped forward during this crisis. It is truly amazing how you were able to help us get through these difficult past few months. I truly believe it was because your giving spirit helping in so many different ways that helped bring a welcoming and calming spirit to everyone who comes to Mass. After much prayer, discernment and discussion with other priests and parishes these past two months, we will be updating current guidelines for worship during this pandemic. There will no longer be a need to have three ushers scheduled. Ushers, there is no need to usher people to their pew when they come to Mass as they can seat themselves. People if you would be so kind when you find your pew to move to the middle of the pew. Also, we will not need to have the ushers dismiss people at the end of Mass in an orderly fashion. Other churches are finding out that people now are familiar with the need of keeping social distance, etc. People with underlying conditions or concerns can simply remain in the pews for a few moments until most people have left.
