

NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

Every so often a solemnity like the Assumption falls on a Sunday, giving more prominence to this special feast of Mary. At the end of her earthly life, God drew Mary Home, assuming her into Heaven where she would reign as Queen until the end of time. From the beginning of her life on earth, when she was immaculately conceived, until the end, the Blessed Virgin Mary conformed her life to God's will. Let us look to her as a model as we endeavor to discern God's will for us

Over the past couple of months, my devotion to Our Lady has skyrocketed. In Fatima, Our Blessed Mother asked the three small children and all of us to pray one rosary each day. Our Lady in Medjugorje has asked by way of the visionaries to pray three rosaries each day. I have been doing that the past few months as it is truly amazing the graces that flow when I stay close to Our Lady. Coinciding with praying more rosaries, I have started to fast Wednesdays and Fridays on bread and water. Remember that the Church has yet to approve Medjugorje as the apparitions are still taking place. Here are two of her messages: "I would like the people to pray along with me these days. And to pray as much as possible! And to fast strictly on Wednesdays and Fridays, and every day to pray at least: the joyful, sorrowful and glorious mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary" (August 14, 1984). "Dear children! Today I call you especially now to advance against Satan by means of prayer. Satan wants to work still more now that you know he is at work. Dear children, put on the armor for battle and with the Rosary in your hand defeat him! Thank you for having responded to my call" (August 8, 1985). Lastly, I have signed up for a December pilgrimage to Mexico City where Our Lady of Guadalupe has appeared. There has been just a really strong awareness of Our Lady's love for us as our Mother. Our Mother would not ask this of us if she knew that we couldn't do it.

Jesus tells us, "Ask and you shall receive." Did you know that one of our parishioners is already a Parish Nurse? Rebecca Schmidt from St. Francis of Assisi completed the first parish nurse training in 1997 through St. Ben's. Fr Bill Vouk was the pastor at that time. She currently works fulltime with CentraCare, so let's see what the Good Lord wants to bring about here. There is no doubt that our elders and shut-ins could receive more regular attention. For instance, Linus and Marge Lehner, who are married 71 years, live in the apartments beside St Mary's. They are the greatest couple and are most grateful to still be living on their own. I have been in touch with their children, yet Lord only knows how long they can remain living here. A Parish Nurse can help them and so many of our parishioners.
