NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

This time of year, is one of transition. The casual rhythms of the summer, often marked by leisure and vacation activities, give way to a new school year and a more rigorous schedule. The Gospel passages from last week and this week hint a transition for Jesus and His disciples as well. Jesus tells them that soon He will be handed over to authorities who will kill Him but that after three days He would rise. The days of traveling around Galilee – far from Jerusalem – are ending. As we anticipate the coming of fall, let us each resolve to carry our own cross through all life's rhythms, reassured by the promise of resurrection.

Priests of our diocese recently received a letter from Bishop regarding people may request letter endorsing their request for a religious exemption from COVID-19 vaccination. "Most often this is for their employers, but as other organization consider mandates of various levels, pastor may be asked to sign letter for other settings as well. As bishop, I discourage pastors or other parish staff from signing such letters. First, it inserts you and the Church into what are in fact human resource matters between the individual and employers or other leaders of organizations who are able legitimately require vaccination for public health purposes.

Second, individuals may have a range of motivations for vaccine refusal, and I am concerned the letter may be used for purposes other than genuine conscience concerns rooted in Catholic teaching.

Third, there is no known requirement that an individual have such a signed letter to qualify for a religious exemption, nor any experience that shows having a letter is helpful to individuals seeking an exemption. Each employer or organization may have its own procedures, but there is no reason to believe that a person would be denied a legitimate exemption in the absence of a letter from a pastor. As we continue to struggle with the pandemic, I continue to encourage all those eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine safely to do so. Having our pastors become involved if efforts to bypass vaccination seems contrary to this goal." Bishop Donald Kettler

People have been asking me if I have been vaccinated. Yes, I have been vaccinated. As some of you know of my past in leaving the priesthood, etc. I am ashamed of not remaining obedient to my promises as I now strive to be more obedient. When I became ordained (1997), I placed my hands into the hands of Bishop John Kinney who asked me, "Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors?" I recently heard someone say, 'it is my body and no one is going to tell me what to put into my body.' Yet we know that from our Bible, Jesus tells us that our body is the temple of the Holy Spirit. Jesus has made a home in us. When Bishop Kettler strongly endorses receiving the vaccine, I found it easy to make my decision. Let's continue to pray for one another that God's graces will help us during these ever-challenging times.
