#### Notes from Fr David

January is not a common month for weddings in this country. Nevertheless, a wedding is at the center of our weekend's Gospel. It is at this wedding feast that Jesus performs His first miracle, changing water into wine. Though we are not here to celebrate a wedding, this celebration includes both a feast and miracle that takes place in our presence – the bread and wine becoming Christ's Body and Blood – and give thanks for the invitation we have been given to this Eucharistic feast.

WOW ... you continually amaze me! Your kindness and generosity is off the charts! I finally got around to opening all your cards and gifts. Most meaningful are your messages with such love and support. I feel so blessed to be your pastor. My Christmas and New Year was most special. My Mom flew down to Arizona for the winter months Christmas Eve Day. She is 87 yrs. old and still gets around very well. Many of my sisters are able to spend time with her, so she is not alone.

Thanks for the prayers as I got my Covid test results back and it was negative. Upon Bishop Kettler's recommendation, I plan to continue to mask during Mass. Thanks Eucharistic ministers for masking as well. Unfortunately, I know of people who choose not to worship with us due to just a few people are actually wearing masks. Who would have thought we would be where we are a few years ago?

I have wondered why vaccinated people are getting COVID-19 lately? I am no expert by any means, but it seems a couple of factors are at play, starting with the emergence of the highly contagious omicron variant. Omicron is more likely to infect people, even if it doesn't make them very sick, and its surge coincided with the holiday travel season in many places. People might mistakenly think the COVID-19 vaccines will completely block infection, but the shots are mainly designed to prevent severe illness, says Louis Mansky, a virus researcher at the University of Minnesota.
