<u>Sacrament of Baptism:</u> Contact the office three months before desired baptism date.



PresenceThe Story of the Eucharist

God authors His great love story not only with words, but with deeds. All of God's mighty deeds throughout history make up one beautiful narrative of salvation, which culminates in the Paschal Mystery.

While you are watching TV/Internet Mass...

Remember you are participating in a Holy Mass.

Before Mass, clean and put everything around you in order.

Wear decent clothing as when you attend Sunday Mass.

Consider fasting 1 hour before.

Get rid of distractions away from the screen like gadgets and food or any reading materials.

Do some initial preparation prayers before Mass.

During the Mass, actively respond, singing if possible

Write down your family intentions and place them on a table.

Stay put in the area of the TV or computer and avoid standing and doing things not related to the Mass.

During the consecration, kneel before the presence of Christ in the Sacred host and wine.

Avoid holding hands even at home during the Mass


Do the Spiritual Communion since you cannot physically receive Holy Communion.

Pray that the COVID-19 will end very soon and pray for all the medical practitioners.

An Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.





As I've said before, suspending Masses and closing our churches are the hardest decisions I've made as a bishop, but this has been the right thing to do. Minnesota has, thus far, not suffered to the extent that other states have during this pandemic. I believe it is because we are closely following the guidance and recommendations of state and federal authorities. The health and safety of our parishioners and neighbors is paramount, and we must do what we reasonably can to protect them. Our actions and sacrifices are providing a pro-life witness to everyone in our state.

While mitigation efforts to date have helped, the coronavirus continues to pose a serious health threat, particularly to the elderly and those with underlying illnesses. Even people who don't show symptoms can be carriers of this virus, thus putting others at risk. After consulting with members of my staff, local health authorities and others, I have decided the following:

- 1. Through May 15, church buildings and parish offices are to remain closed to the public. Phone messages and emails will still be checked, however.
- 2. There should be no Eucharistic adoration.
- 3. There should be no gatherings, of any kind, of more than ten people.
- 4. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is still to be offered, though only by appointment.
- 5. First Communions should be delayed until after May 15.
- Funeral Masses remain prohibited during this period; graveside services are allowed with no more than 10 people present. A memorial Mass should be scheduled for a date after May 15.
- 7. Baptisms should be rescheduled. Parents withing the parish boundaries wanting, nevertheless, to baptize their children during this time should contact me
- 8. Confirmations for the entire month of May are canceled.

There is a deep longing among our faithful to come together again for the celebration of the Eucharist. The current situation has required everyone to make great sacrifices in the way we pray and worship. I look forward to the time when we can safely worship together again. Right now, it's important to help parishioners to see and experience Christ's presence in other ways – in their families and in their communities. We are an Easter people, filled with the hope given to us by the Risen Christ. It is not too early to start thinking about what kinds of joyous liturgical celebrations you might plan when we are able to gather again.
