

NOTES FROM FR. DAVID

Forty days from now we will find ourselves at the foot of the cross. How can we prepare ourselves for this? Jesus' words at the beginning of His ministry are apt: "Repent and believe in the gospel." Let us ask ourselves how we have sinned. Let us feel remorse for those times we have fallen short. Let us resolve to turn back to God and live out the gospel in our day-to-day lives. Let us find ourselves able to approach the cross forty days from now with profound gratitude for what our Lord has done for us.

Welcome back choir and vocal ensembles beginning this weekend under certain guidelines. It has been difficult for everyone, but especially with your music ministry no doubt this pandemic has been most challenging for you. As a priest, I find myself forgetting how to sing the various parts as it is coming up on one year since I sang them. Lord only knows how long it will be before we are allowed to sing the various Mass parts. Please note that congregational singing still remains prohibited until further notice.

Bishop Kettler: "Regarding the season of Lent, the usual penitential regulations apply. However, if a person is ill for any reason or taking care of someone who is, they are dispensed from Lenten disciplines and sacrifices. The illness and care a person are providing are their Lenten sacrifice." To experience Lent with love means caring for those who suffer or feel abandoned and fearful because of the COVID-19 pandemic. In these days of deep uncertainty about the future, let us keep in mind the Lord's words: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you" (Isaiah 43:1).

Beginning Ash Wednesday, there will be a change taking place in the opening prayer of the priest: "... the conclusion of this prayer is to omit the word "one". The words "one God, for ever and ever" are simply replaced with "God, for ever and ever". There is no mention of "one" in the Latin. The Cardinal Prefect has pointed out the importance of affirming this Christological truth amid the religious pluralism of today's world.

This is very holy time of year. Lent is a time to reflect on where we are with God. Lent is a time to reflect upon how might I grow in my Catholic faith? Please note the various opportunities to deepen your faith with Stations of the Cross, Adoration and Sacrament of Reconciliation, etc. Many of your personal devotional practices are so grace-filled. First and foremost, the graces of the Eucharist are par excellence by far such as attending daily Mass.

With our Smelt/Fish Fry and Raffle taking place near the end of March, each and every one in our three parishes are strongly encouraged to take part. As numbers continue to diminish, the only way for each of our parishes to remain vibrant is to come together as Three Saints Parishes. In fact, the Diocese is asking us to reach out even more and work more closely with the Holdingford area parishes.
