Pope Benedict April 16, 1927– December 31, 2022



Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger became Pope after the death of St. John Paul II on April 19, 2005. He resigned on February 28, 2013.Pope Benedict's body will lie in state at the Vatican as of January 2nd. It is custom that the nine days following the

funeral of a Pope are observed as official days of mourning in Rome and throughout the Church. The Novemdiales, as they are called, may be observed in different ways in the various Particular Churches. A sample set of novena prayers will be made available on the USCCB website. At Pope Emeritus Benedict's request, a simple funeral will be celebrated. Pope Francis presided at that funeral liturgy on Thursday, January 5th at St. Peter's Basilica.
