We are called to recognize the shifting needs in today's world and anticipate others that will impact the Church. We must use creative approaches to stewardship, evangelization, education and outreach, adapting to these new realities while remaining faithful to the Gospel. 
Today it is more important than ever for young girls to have high self-esteem regarding the changes in

Feast of the Immaculate Conception: December 9th Monday

On December 8, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but this year the feast has been transferred to Monday, December 9th which references Mary's conception in her mother's womb without the stain of Original Sin. Since Blessed Virgin Mary is the Patroness of the United States, this feast is the Patronal Feast Day and it is a Holy Day of Obligation.

First Sunday of Advent

Happy New Year! Today we begin the Church year and the season of Advent – a new Liturgical Year! We begin to prepare for what could be one of the greatest events in our lives, Christ's Christmas coming. Christ will come in glory and power this Christmas if only we have faith to open the door.

Vigilance and waiting come naturally to those in love. The loving father of the prodigal son waited and watched for a long time for his son's return. So vigilant was his watching that he was able to spot his son "while he was still a long way off" (Lk 15:20). "Jacob served seven years" to gain the privilege of marrying "Rachel, yet they seemed to him but a few days because of his love for her" (Gn 29:20). Simeon loved God and so waited vigilantly in the temple for the appearance of the Infant Jesus (Lk 2:26ff). Jesus, Who is Love, waited several decades in the obscurity of Nazareth until the right time to begin his public ministry. We will wait enough for what we love enough.

This Advent, some of us will wait hours in line to buy this year's popular gift. Many children will rise well before dawn on Christmas morning and wait for hours until they can open presents. Parents and children will wait in long lines to visit Santa. Who we wait for says a lot about who we really are.

We're tempted to hide from God (Gn 3:10) in Christmas customs, activities, and even in mindless consumerism. There is a Herod in each of us that is threatened by and afraid of Christ and Christmas. We must change, repent, and die to self. We need time to let Him change our hearts. We need the four-week preparation of Advent, or we will run away from Christ and will miss a true Christmas.

Advent Penance service: on December 8th, Sunday from 2pm-5pm we are having our Communal Penance service with prayer and individual confession for our ACC at St. Mary's, Upsala. I encourage everyone to make use of this opportunity in preparation for receiving abundance of grace during this Christmas celebration.
