Notes from Father David

"Welcome one another," St Paul commands us, "as Christ welcomed you." Indeed, the Lord welcomes us to His House each weekend as we gather together to celebrate the Eucharist. But let us not forget the first part, that we are also called to welcome one another. Moreover, as St Paul welcomes Gentiles, and the wolf became a guest of the lamb, we are called to welcome those who are not like us: those coming from other cultures, speaking other languages, or expressing other viewpoints. Let us welcome continually all to this celebration.

Amazing fourteen young people (11th graders) who took part in a confirmation retreat held the Friday after Thanksgiving at St Mary's. Parents and parishioners, you must be very proud of them. It was beautiful to see 100% participation as every one of them attended! I loved their involvement from 10:30am until after 6pm. Their participation throughout the day was most impressive. Our day concluded with Holy Mass. A special thanks to Chantelle Frie as Confirmation Coordinator who organized the day as well as Marcia Krebs from the Sobieski, Flensburg and Randall parishes.

Thanks to everyone who helped to make Thanksgiving Day most blessed. Our two Masses were very well attended! You continually amaze me! The graces were also most present at the Word of Life Church as an estimated 100 people were served. It was truly amazing as nearly the entire serving line were people from our three parishes! A precious moment came when I introduced myself to a gentleman and he said that he heard this was non-denominal church. He was confused when he pointed to my white roman collar and saw a priest here. I simply stated how we all are on the same team and how our churches love working together. Indeed, we need to strengthen our community muscles by working together as three parishes as well as six parishes (with Holdingford area parishes) along with the Christian Churches in our communities.

It has been quiet on the home front regarding any interest from you about a possible Parish Life Committee (PLC) for each of our parishes. This committee which is recommended by our diocese could help bring about more social and spiritual activities. As far as how often this committee would meet will be determined by its members (perhaps quarterly). Unlike Pastoral Councils in the past, the Pastor need not be present at these meetings. With fewer and fewer priests and parishioners, a topic that no one wants to address is how long will some of our parishes be able to remain open? I cannot help but think the more vibrant and active each one of our churches become will bring more graces and blessings. We have been blessed by those who went before us. Will we leave our parishes in a better place when we are long gone? PLC's have a unique opportunity to build up parish life. The pandemic of 2020 isolated parishioners from one another, and it has been difficult to reengage social and emotional relationships in the same manner.

Our six parishes (including the three from the Holdingford area) will hosting Penance Service: Sunday, December 11 from 2-5pm at St Mary's in Upsala. Mercy is a strong kind of love. It hangs in whatever. To experience it can be life-changing and a compass to live by, whether as people living out faith or as people who have known strong rejection. It is central to us as Catholics. We will be blessed to have four priests available of which three are retired: Fr Bob Harren, Fr David Maciej, Fr Gregory Mastey and Fr Eb Schefers. During those three hours, come when works best for you.
