Notes from Fr David

Living as a disciple is a daunting task. Jesus challenges us and the way we live our lives. In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus explains that keeping the commandments is not enough to merit eternal life; a disciple must give what they have to the poor and follow Him. The man who asked the question walked away sad. Even His disciples couldn't believe how difficult it was to get to Heaven. Only then did Jesus comfort them. Though we cannot save ourselves, with God all things are possible. Let us give thanks to God today for enabling us to achieve what we cannot do ourselves.

At the direction of Pope Francis, the Synod of Bishops in Rome has convoked a synod that will run from 2021 until 2023 entitled "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." It officially opens on October 10th in Rome and on October 16/17th in dioceses around the world. In time, the process will begin by listening to you. How is the Spirit alive and well in our diocese? Pope Francis deliberately wants to engage the People of God regarding what the Church needs to be doing to stay relevant.

"Thanks so much for your prayers as our workshop in Alexandria went very well. Bishop Kettler, priests and deacons connected very well in prayer, listening to various talks and praying together. Bishop Seitz from El Paso, TX specializes in the liturgy or Mass as we spent time talking about it. Some of his words: "Celebrate the liturgy as it's the most important thing I do. The early Church would sing from start to finish. There's something that music does that raises our minds to God. At Mass, we priests need to be doing no more than one thing at a time and not multi-tasking. Mass is extremely personal, but not private. Everyone has a central role. We're uniting people throughout the world and throughout time. Moments of silence are of extreme importance."

Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of human life. What will each one of us do this month that will make a difference?

Thanks so much for all your prayers the past couple months. I am so grateful that Jessie Johnson and Randi Klasen stepped forward expressing their willingness to work in our parishes. Please help me welcome them. As they now introduce themselves, please remain patient as it will take time for them to get acclimated to these new positions.
