### **800th Anniversary of the Nativity Scene**

Catholics will have the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence from Dec. 8th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to Feb. 2, 2024, the feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ in the Temple. The key to this spiritual privilege lies in prayer before a Nativity scene at a Franciscan church, such as the Poor Clares' Monastery in Sauk Rapids whose Nativity scene will be in place until Feb. 2nd. Just follow the signs to the Chapel (open 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Mass is at 7:00a.m. daily). No reservation necessary but call the sisters (320) 251-3556 with questions. The tradition of the Nativity scene was inspired by St. Francis himself, who crafted the first one in Greccio. Italy, in 1223 symbolizing the profound mystery of the Incarnation.

During the feast of St. Francis of Assisi on Oct. 4th, the faithful gathered at the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi, Italy. The occasion honored the beloved Italian saint and the 800th anniversary of the approval of the Rule of St. Francis, alongside the inception of the Nativity scene in Greccio. As part of the celebration of this Franciscan centenary, the Conference of the Franciscan Family sought the approval of Pope Francis for a plenary indulgence by "visiting the churches run by Franciscan families throughout the world and stopping in prayer in front of the Nativity scenes set up there.' The Apostolic Penitentiary welcomed the request, and Pope Francis granted the faithful the opportunity to receive this indulgence under the usual conditions: a plenary indulgence will be granted to anyone who prays in front of a nativity scene (kneeling or standing), prays an Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be and the Creed, detaches themselves from all sin and takes part in sacramental confession, holy communion and prayer for the intentions of the Pope.

#### THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

It is a long-standing tradition on the feast of Epiphany, to bless Chalk to be used to mark our homes, asking God's protection upon the home and on all who live and visit there. For the blessing, the chalk is used to mark the following symbols over the doorway of the home.

#### 20+C+M+B+24

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. They also abbreviate the Latin words for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," that means, "<u>may Christ bless this</u> <u>dwelling.</u>" The crosses represent the protection of the Precious Blood of Christ, whom we invoke, and the holiness of the three Magi sanctified by their adoration of the infant Jesus. Please use the following prayer when you mark the symbols over the doorway.

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who live in here. May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
